Worship in November

November 2, 2025 – All Saints Sunday

Sermon Text: Luke 19:1-10 Jesus encounters Zacchaeus, a rich man who is also a lost sinner. Moved by Jesus' acceptance of him, Zacchaeus becomes a model of discipleship. In immediate response to being restored to God's people, Zacchaeus ministers to the poor and seeks reconciliation with those whom he has wronged. **Contemporary worship at 8AM.**

November 9, 2025 – 22nd Sunday after Pentecost

Sermon Text: Luke 20:27-38 Some Sadducees, who do not believe in the resurrection of the dead, try to trap Jesus. They formulate the convoluted case of a serial widow who marries a succession of seven brothers. Jesus responds by teaching about God to whom all are alive and in whom all relationships are fulfilled.

November 16, 2025 – 23rd Sunday after Pentecost

Sermon Text: Luke 21:5-19 As history moves toward God's fulfillment there will be frightening signs and events. Before the end, believers will draw strength from their relationship to God and will be given the words they need to testify and to endure without fear. **Contemporary worship at 8AM.**

November 23, 2025 – Christ the King Sunday

Sermon Text: Luke 23:33-43 Amid scoffing and slander from those who sarcastically call him Messiah and king, Jesus reveals that to be Messiah and king is to give one's life for others. Here he uses his power to welcome a despised sinner to paradise but puts his own death into God's hands.

November 30, 2025 – 1st Sunday of Advent

Sermon Text: Matthew 24:36-44 Jesus describes his second coming as a sudden, turbulent event that will bring about deep change to our normal, day-to-day lives. Therefore, he urges people to stay awake, be aware, and wait expectantly, because the Son of Man will come unannounced.





October Update on Church Financial Status From The Finance Committee:

As reported in the current Newsletter (Financial Reports Section), the General Fund has a Negative balance of \$1817 - this significant improvement from Negative \$7420 at end of August was largely due to Memorial Contributions being elected by Ritter and Sheetz families to go to the General fund and the successful Basket Party allocating 50% of profits to the General Fund. Thank you to all responsible for these allocations and support.

Our congregation is, however, still not meeting the income needs of the budget for 2025, which was approved by the congregation last December. This means some Bills are being paid by borrowing "internally" from other accounts with positive balances. Also to note: This year is not the start of this issue as the General Fund is Negative by \$25,100 since the start of 2023.

Our request for your consideration:

The committee has met 4 times this year to discuss and is asking all members to consider the following actions to help us recover from the current situation:

- Increase your giving even a small increase by many will help.
- Start to buy, or increase your purchases of, Gift Cards from the church on the 1st Sunday of each month. The church receives a % of each sale.
- Review the Simply Giving program and consider setting up automated donations
 to the church which helps smooth the income stream over the whole year, and
 makes your giving easier and typically more consistent.
- Support fundraisers and special events at the church note that not all fundraisers and events benefit the General Fund.
- If you own products through Thrivent that generate Thrivent Choice Dollars, consider directing them to our church as we generally receive over \$1000 of Thrivent Choice Dollars per year.

Kindly consider how you can help, with respect to your current individual or family situation.

If you have already done this, we thank you for your prayerful consideration and any resulting actions.

The Finance Committee thanks everyone for their financial support of the church and our 2025 budget along with all other donations and contributions you are providing to the church to support our mission.

The committee continues to monitor our Financial situation closely and will communicate further as needed.

The following devotion was used to open the Church Council Meeting in October, was submitted by Terry Kemp ...

The woman sat across the table from me and leveled an expectant stare. 'You aren't going to hold a Halloween party are you? I don't want the church to be associated with all that evil." I was a brand new youth director in my first full time youth ministry position. I had no idea how to respond. She continued her intense stare and said, "I think we should have a Harvest Party or Fall Festival instead."

I have always loved Halloween. I grew up in churches that celebrated Halloween with cross-generational parties. I identify Halloween with connection to a larger community and abundant generosity. Anyone can ring the doorbell and get a treat regardless of who they are or where they come from It is the one night a year when we wander our neighborhood and meet our neighbors in common purpose to wear costumes and get candy.

Halloween's deep roots in the Christian church—All Hallow's Eve, the night before All Saint's Day—provides us an opportunity to laugh at death. We can dress up as the things we fear the most, which for children can help them to overcome and overpower those fears. We can play at being spooky monsters without fear of celebrating or promoting evil. Because we know that death and evil have no power over us. We have been redeemed by Christ on the cross.

Changing the name of Halloween, trying to soften its impact, or to pretend our "wholesome" activities are better than those of the world outside of the church only serves to create an atmosphere of shame. Regardless of whether we have a Fall Festival or a Harvest Party, people will still be celebrating Halloween with their neighbors. Martin Luther said that a theologian of the cross calls a thing what it is. The church is uniquely situated to speak to death, to suffering, and to the gift of life we are given in Christ. Our witness to that life in Christ is more powerful when we work to meet people where they are.

The year the woman asked me that question we held a Fall Festival, because I was new and young and worried about my job. The next year we hosted a community Halloween party. Four times as many people showed up.

Prayer: Help us to witness to our communities with grace and compassion. Help us to overcome our fears, whatever those may be and trust in the promises you make to us. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen

SIMPLY GIVING

Save time, simplify your life, and support your church! We're keeping up with the times by offering our parishioners another way to help our ministry. Our Electronic Giving Program called Simply Giving is an automated program that will allow you to make contributions without having to lift a pen to write a check or reach into your wallet for cash! And, this method of giving also saves our "counting team" time and trouble every week to open envelopes.

Here is how it works:

You authorize a specified amount of money to be electronically transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the Church account. You also specify the frequency of the transfer.

It is fast, safe and easy! In fact, it is less risky than checks, as it cannot be lost or stolen, or destroyed. The electronic transfer will cost you NOTHING and you save the cost of the check. The Church will issue you a donation statement for your tax records, and your bank statements will provide you with a record of transfer as additional proof of your contributions. Donations via electronic transfer can be made to our General Fund, Benevolence, and/or World Hunger and/or Building Maintenance.

Many members/families of Trinity are currently using Simply Giving.

You can change your amount or frequency with two weeks notice. And, of course, you can cancel your authorization of transfer at any time by notifying the church office. But we believe that once you have enjoyed the convenience and savings of this new program, you won't want to go back to the old way of contributing to our church!


