There was motion and second to approve the nominees and a vote by the congregation approved them.

Finance Committee Annual Report - 2025

The Finance Committee met four times this year.

In May and July we met to discuss the financial challenge with the General Fund being well into the negative through April, and addressed the challenge with weekly communication in the bulletin as well as championing strategies to improve the situation.

Strategies to support the General Fund included new fundraisers, pushing support of other church events and existing fundraising opportunities, and ongoing activities like the Gift Card Program, our top fundraiser.

The congregation stepped up in a variety of ways to help finish the year in the black.

The committee also met in September and October to draft the proposed expense budget for 2026, which was presented and approved by Church Council and then presented and approved at the congregational meeting in December.

The budget for 2026 is an increase of approximately 3.28% over last year, with insurance increases and a modest salary increase for the church staff primarily contributing to the overall increased budget.

The committee will continue to keep a close eye on the financial situation as we start the new year and will continue doing so throughout the year. Additional discussions and strategies will be executed as needed.

Communication in the bulletin has been modified following feedback at the December Congregational meeting. A longer message will be in the Newsletter monthly, only.

Feedback to your Finance Committee is encouraged and welcomed as we walk along together in our journey as Christians.

I would like to thank the committee members for their support and all of their efforts this year.

I would also like to acknowledge and thank the congregation for pulling together and, collectively, assessing their personal situations and taking appropriate actions to make a positive impact during a challenging financial year.

As seen in the final Treasurer's Report, the General Fund ended in the Positive for the year at +\$7781, so we are starting off 2026 in a slightly better position than the start of last year (+\$5394).



Let's keep working together throughout the new year to use God's blessings to achieve our congregation's stated mission.

Technology Annual Report

Hi Everyone,

Believe it or not, this year we were able to add another camera. This was made possible through another generous gift. This camera is one like we bought last year. So, we are looking at taking one of the original camcorders and using it as a portable camera we could use wherever we may need or want to.

The other thing we have been doing is watching a lot of videos on line about livestreaming church services. We have been learning a lot from them. We think it has helped us give you a better livestream.

This year we concluded that our computers in the office needed to be upgraded. So, we bought 2 new Dell laptops. One for Karen and one for Pastor Gene.

The last thing we are doing is upgrading our internet. If you remember, about 4 1/2 years ago we upgraded it. Well, the "New Subscriber" deal has long ended. We are looking not just to upgrade the speed but save us money. We are actually changing back to Windstream. Comcast offered us 150 mbs down and 30 mbs up for \$200. Windstream offered us 1000 mbs up and down for \$112. This is a "New Subscriber" offer of course. The regular cost for this right now is \$162. Mbs is megabytes per second. This will be done by fiberoptic cable instead of a copper cable. Yeah, I know we just put in the Comcast cable, but we will save about \$88 dollars a month. We are paying \$169 right now to Comcast for 30 mbs down and 5 mbs up. The change over should be completed in January.

Social Ministry Report - 2025

It has been another busy year for Social Ministry here at Trinity.

First, a big **thank you** to each of you who participated in any of the various projects - be it through donations of goods (food, pajamas, toys, etc.) or services (including getting the goods to other organizations) or cash donations, including the monthly freewill offerings.

Here is who we helped this year.

PJ Project - We collected more than 100 pairs of pajamas for children and adults, which are distributed to local shelters and other local organizations.

Elf Bags - We collected \$225 along with family board games, playing cards, popcorn, and hot chocolate for distribution locally by Boyertown Multi-Service.

Angel Tree - Members provided Christmas gifts for distribution by Boyertown Multi-Service for needy folks in the local area.

Boyertown Area Multi-Service - This year there were several food drives for the Multi-Service Food Pantry along with the freewill offerings.

Samaritan's Purse - This organization, under the direction of Franklin Graham (son of Billy Graham), distributes shoebox gifts along with evangelical "good news" around the world. We contributed about 50 boxes again this year.

Christmas Sharing - The Lutheran Home at Topton received our donations of new clothing and other items to help make the residents feel a bit more comfortable there.

Salvation Army - We supplied monetary assistance to help support their community outreach programs.

Beacon of Hope - is a charity helping the homeless in our area. 2025 is the first year we began working with them with financial assistance.

More - \$500 was collected and contributed to the family of Zack Johnson to help pay for funeral expenses. This and more can be seen on the third page of the treasurer's report including contributions to local area organizations in support of their service.
